

Outlaw Journalism / Alan Watt Disappearance Timeline (2008–2025)

1. OutlawJournalism.com /p=85 — “Glen Kealey, Alan Watt’s Inspiration?”

Earliest mention: Dec 2008 – Jan 2009 (forums, Andre’s OutlawJournalism portal)

Last confirmed live: mid-2010 (YouTube references)

Status (2025): URL excluded from Wayback Machine

Notes: Domain under exclusion; likely robots.txt or legal request. No HTML copies survive, only forum quotes.

2. FreeAudioNetwork.wordpress.com — “No Longer Listening to Alan Watt”

Published: April 14 2009

Content: Commentary referencing Outlaw Journalism article at /p=85

Status: Accessible but intermittently delisted

Notes: Key secondary citation confirming Outlaw Journalism article’s existence.

3. RBN Broadcast — “CTTM Live on RBN 215 USA and The Kiss of Death” (Dec 15 2008)

Original broadcast: 50 min (unedited) on Dec 15 2008

Edited repost: 45 min on CuttingThroughTheMatrix.com

Archived mirrors: 2009–2012

Status (2025): Archive.org entries missing or unavailable

Notes: Caller mentions Glen Kealey at ~44:50 mark; absent in edited version.

4. Swedish Forum Thread — “Another View and Criticism of Alan Watt”

First posts: Late 2008

Last cache: 2012–2013

Status: Partial fragments preserved

Notes: Confirms discussion of Andre’s article; external corroboration of its existence.

5. Related Mirrors and Aggregators

Scribd: “Alan Watt Unplugged” — limited preview

Archive.org: “Deconstructing Alan Watt” — intact

YouTube: “Alan Watt Lies, Threats and Plagiarism” — link to /p=85 now dead.

Pattern Summary (2008–2025)

Across five key nodes — OutlawJournalism.com, RBN archives, FreeAudioNetwork, YouTube, and

regional forums — the disappearance follows a sequence typical of layered data attrition:

- 2008–2009: Article appears and spreads.
- 2010–2012: OutlawJournalism domain delisted; RBN full MP3 begins disappearing.
- 2016–2018: Archive.org mirrors of long audio vanish.
- 2025: Only indirect witnesses remain — quotes, partial text, and shorter broadcast.

Interpretation: Evidence suggests coordinated link decay, though the causes remain undocumented. This report maintains neutrality, serving solely as a preservation brief.
